"Ut omnes unum sint" – That they may all be one

priestly prayer, uttered on the threshold of His Passion, is this simple but world-altering phrase: may all be one" (John 17:21). This petition is not a footnote to the Gospel but its culmination, a theological summit where divine intention and human vocation meet. Christ does not pray merely for harmony, nor for the absence of conflict. He prays for something deeper, something far more daring: a unity that mirrors the life of God Himself - "as you, Father, are in me and I am in you, may to the abandonment of spiritual they also be in us".

Delbrêl observed, "We do not go to God alone. The closer we draw to Him, the more we become one with all who are drawn by the same love."1

Unity, then, is not merely a fruit of Christian life - it is its very substance. To be a disciple is to enter the movement of divine love which ceaselessly draws all into One. Discipleship that does not bear this mark of oneness is malformed. This unity is not uniformity, but mutual indwelling. As Christ abides in the Father and the Father in Him, so we are called to abide in one another - not as an ideal, but as the very measure of our faithfulness.

To the degree that we resist this unity, we resist Christ Himself.
