Habemus Papam!

This Sunday, the Church marks the Fourth Sunday of Easter, traditionally known as Good Shepherd Sunday—a day when we listen attentively to the voice of Christ who calls, gathers, and tends his flock. That this year it should coincide with the election of a new Supreme Pontiff is a grace we ought not take lightly. In the ancient rite of conclave, we have witnessed once more the unity and continuity of the Church, guided not by human ambition but by the quiet movement of the Holy Spirit. The white smoke rising from the Sistine Chapel has become, in our sign of peace day, reassurance: the Church, even in her trials and tensions, is never abandoned.

With the joyful election of Pope Leo XVI, the entire People of God are invited anew to pray and to accompany him with generous hearts. The weight of Peter's keys is not light. The burden is real and at times immense. Yet so too is the promise: "I am with you always" (Mt 28:20). The Pope, though elected in seclusion, steps into a deeply one public role. of service. witness. leadership, and response must be one of prayerful that support, he may strengthened by the same Spirit who called him forth. In these early days of his pontificate, the whole Church is summoned into a spiritual solidarity with him, to walk with him as he begins to shepherd a global flock.

It is also fitting that these events have unfolded in the month of May, traditionally dedicated to our Blessed Lady. The Church now gathers, like the beloved disciple, under Mary's mantle. She who once said "yes" at the Annunciation stands also at the heart of the Church's new beginning. Let us entrust our Holy Father to her maternal care and renew our own commitment to thanksgiving, and fidelity. This is not merely a moment of change or transition. It is a summons to communion—with deeper Good Shepherd, with the successor of Peter, and with our Blessed Mother. May we respond not with hesitation, but with trust, joy, and quiet resolve.

Second Collection 11 May - Priest Training Fund

The priesthood has always been essential to the life of the Church, from the time of Jesus until today. Good Shepherd Sunday is the day we pray for vocations, for our priests, and take up the Priest Training Fund second collection. This fund pays for the formation of men to become priests in our Archdiocese. We are blessed to have 9 men in formation to the Priesthood for our Archdiocese. However, it costs £30,000 a year to sponsor each seminarian. They study for 6 years before being ordained a Catholic priest.

On Thurs 26 June, an evening of adoration and veneration of the relic for young adults is taking place. On Fri 27 June, Archbishop John will preside at the 6pm Solemn Mass of the Sacred Heart, which will include the veneration of the relic. On Sat 28 June, there will be a "morning with Carlo Acutis", which will include Mass, adoration, rosary and a talk on the relic. General reminder on making donations/offerings using the portals.

The parish is deeply grateful for the generosity of parishioners in their continued support of the Church's life and mission. This reminder is offered simply to help ensure that the purpose for which each donation is made is properly understood and honoured. Those making donations through the parish's digital payment portals - either online or via the donation machines in the church - are reminded to select the category that best reflects the intended purpose of their offering. Those requesting the celebration of Holy Mass for a particular intention, whether for the repose of the soul of a loved one, an occasion of thanksgiving, or a private intention, must select the "Mass Offering" category and, when prompted with 'Do you want to leave a message with your donation?', are asked to state clearly the name or intention for which the Mass is to be offered. To assist with scheduling, it is also advisable to notify the parish office of any preferred date and time, so that arrangements may be made and your intention properly entered in the register and honoured at the altar.
