Dear Sisters and Brothers,

### **June is the Month of the Sacred Heart**

Like mother. Like Son. Like Son. Like mother. The sacred, pure heart of Jesus. The immaculate, undefiled heart of Mary. How does such a heart come to be? Clearly the initiative is God's, who prepares the human heart to be his dwelling place. At the same time, the human heart must be receptive and cooperative with this work of God, open to the power of the Spirit at work within. Like Mary, who found favour with God. Mary knew that a place must be readied, there must be room in her heart for God. It must be rid of all clutter, the kinds of things that Jesus said rendered the heart defiled: evil thoughts, greed, malice, deceit, envy, arrogance, anger, and hatred. Such things are not of God. They leave no room in the heart for the Word of God to speak.

A pure heart knows the power of the Word of God to reveal who we are and who we are to become. A pure heart knows the power of the Word of God to continually create anew. Like mother. Like Son. ### **Please keep in your prayers the people of Myanmar/Burma**

Another church in Kayah state, a Catholic stronghold in eastern Myanmar, has been damaged by indiscriminate shelling by the military. Our Lady, Queen of Peace Church in Doungankha village of Demoso township was hit by artillery fire on June 6 morning but there were no casualties, according to church officials. They said there were no people in the church as parishioners had already fled to relatives' homes and the jungle while some priests and elderly nuns remained. The church's walls were badly damaged by the shelling and the windows were broken. It was the third church in Kayah state to be attacked by the military within two weeks. Sacred Heart Church in Kantharyar village near Loikaw was hit by artillery shelling that killed four Catholics and wounded at least eight others on May 23 night. St. Joseph Church in Demoso town, one of the key areas of fighting, was hit by military artillery on May 26 night. The latest attack came

despite a plea by Cardinal Charles Bo for the protection of religious buildings as places of worship and the cultural property of a community covered by international protocols.(CNA)
