Reflection

This week, on Thursday, November 21, as is customary, the Church celebrates the Feast of the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This feast is a beautiful and deeply meaningful tradition within the Catholic Church. According to ancient tradition, when Mary was just a young child, her parents, Saints Joachim and Anne, presented her in the Temple in Jerusalem to dedicate her entirely to God's service.

Though this event is not explicitly described in Scripture, it is cherished by the faithful supported by ancient Christian writings such as the Protoevangelium of James. From the earliest moments of her life, Mary was set apart as holy and wholly devoted to God's will - a devotion she would live out fully through her humble acceptance of God's plan at the Annunciation.

This feast day invites us to reflect the purity, dedication, readiness of Mary's heart from a tender age. By contemplating Mary's early consecration, we are naturally led to consider our own dedication to God, which begins at our Baptism. Just as Mary's life was offered completely to God, we too were presented to Him in Baptism and called to a life of faithful service and holiness. Mary's unwavering faith and obedience serve as an inspiring example for all Christians, as we strive to live out our own calling with the same sincere devotion she displayed throughout her

The Catechism teaches that in Baptism, we are "incorporated into Christ and into his Church ... and called to share in Christ's priestly, prophetic, and royal office". This sacrament marks our dedication and consecration to

God, analogous to Mary's presentation in the Temple. Like Mary, we are called from an early stage in life - whether in childhood or at the moment of Baptism - to a complete, lifelong dedication to the service of God.

In celebrating the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we are reminded that Mary's journey of faith began long before her pivotal role in salvation history became clear. Her unwavering trust and dedication to God serve as a powerful model, reassuring us that a life oriented towards God often starts with small, early seeds of faith. Through Mary's example, we are called to approach our faith with the same sincerity and openness, dedicating ourselves more fully to God's plan and becoming more deeply rooted in our relationship with Him.

Assisted Suicide Bishops' Statement

Catholic Bishops have issued a united call for compassionate action to oppose the Bill on assisted suicide. In a joint statement on Assisted Suicide ahead of the Second Reading of the Terminally III Adults (End of Life) Bill, the bishops have emphasised that true compassion involves caring for and accompanying people through suffering. In the statement, they defend the vulnerable at risk from this legislation, advocate for better-funded palliative care, and express concerns that such a law could lead to a perceived "duty to die" and damage the relationship between medical staff and patients. With only two weeks remaining until the parliamentary debate and vote, the bishops urge Catholics and all who share our belief in the sanctity and value of every human life to contact their local MP, expressing their opposition and requesting that they either oppose or abstain from supporting the Bill.
