Reflection

The Power of the Eucharist Made Real

Reflecting on this week's Gospel at one of our base communities in the district of El Agustino here in Lima, Perú, the women of the group began to speak about the power of the Eucharist they receive at Mass. One of the elder matriarchs shared some potent words. "The Eucharist empowers us. WE commune and partake the Body of Christ each week at Mass. Then we go home with this power, this love, and as women, we all know we do not have time to rest. Even when we are sick, lonely, or tired, we still get up early in the morning, and we feed our children. Is this not an act of Jesus? We have not died like him, but every time we provide food for our family, our pueblo, and the hungry there is a piece of our flesh and blood, our labour of love, in that food." The room was silent, full; pregnant with the Spirit, as we all received a new and deeper sense of the Eucharist.

In the Gospel, Jesus speaks about a new type of bread, one even more powerful than the manna from the desert. The bread that Jesus gives requires the ultimate sacrifice, offering up his body and blood, his very life. It also requires us to live like all the women and men of the world who selflessly sacrifice themselves daily providing for their families, their neighbours, and the hungry of this world in small and/or profound ways.

On today's feast, how will you reveal and make real the power of the Eucharist in your life? How is Jesus calling you to love like him, like the women of Perú, so you can "feed" the others, your family and the hungry of this world?

Today is Father's day. Happy Father's day to all Fathers as you see the joy of your children growing and developing.
