Commandment to Love!

This Sunday's Gospel presents us with something deceptively simple and yet spiritually seismic: the command to love - not a suggestion, not a recommendation. but а commandment. That word changes everything. It dislodges us from the comfortable notion that love is a matter of mood or mutual sympathy. It reminds us that love, in the Christian sense, is not reactive but chosen, not contingent on how we feel but grounded in what is right.

We are not being told to love in the way we think best, or according to our preferred boundaries. We are being summoned to a mode of loving that follows a particular example - one marked by endurance, self-gift, and mercy. It is precisely because love is difficult it must that commanded. Were it natural to us in its truest form, we would not need to be told. The fact that it is given as an imperative reveals that love, properly understood, is not instinct but grace-enabled effort.

This redefines what we often settle for in our relationships. Tolerance is not love. Kindness with limits is not love. Being civil while withholding our hearts is not love. Christian love seeks the good of the other even at cost to the self. It forgives without keeping accounts. It is willing to remain when the world would

walk away. And yes, it is vulnerable, but it is also powerful - because it is rooted not in what we can achieve, but in what we are willing to imitate.

In this light, love becomes a spiritual practice, discipline that transforms us. It is the means by which Christ becomes credible in the world, not through argument but through witness. We are commanded to love because it is the only real sign that we belong to Him - and the only thing that can remake the world.

As Saint Bernard of Clairvaux once wrote, "The measure of love is love without measure."
