Reflection

On this Fourth Sunday of Easter, known as "Good Shepherd Sunday," we celebrate a special day of prayer dedicated to vocations, focusing particularly on the priesthood and consecrated life. This day invites us to reflect on one of the earliest and most profound images of Christ depicted in Church history: The Good Shepherd.

The Gospel according to St. John provides a vivid portrayal of the relationship between Christ, the Good Shepherd, and His flock. It is a relationship so profound that no one can sever the sheep from His protective hand. This connection is founded on a deep reciprocal love and knowledge, offering the flock the invaluable gift of eternal life.

Today's liturgy emphasizes the flock's response to the Good Shepherd through two actions: listening and following. These verbs highlight the essential character of those committed to path of Christ. It begins with listening to His word, which is the foundation of faith and its nourishment. Only those attuned to the voice of the Lord can discern the right moral path that aligns with God's will.

Following Jesus naturally stems from this attentive listening. True discipleship involves absorbing our Lord's teachings and integrating them into daily actions. Each baptized Christian possesses a priestly character, preparing them for distinct roles in the Lord's service. As disciples, we should prioritize promoting vocations, guiding others to hear and follow Christ.

Pope Benedict XVI once highlighted that "true vocation means abandoning personal ambitions to embrace and be directed by God's will. In our contemporary world, where numerous distractions may drown out the Lord's call, it is crucial for every ecclesiastical community to actively nurture and support vocations to the priesthood and consecrated life. Despite technological advances, the human soul still seeks God, and there will always be a need for pastors who can articulate His Word and facilitate encounters with Him through the sacraments".

We commit our aspirations and actions to the Virgin Mary, Mother of all vocations. May her intercession inspire and uphold numerous dedicated servants for both the Church and the world.

This fund pays for the formation of men to become priests in our Archdiocese. We are blessed to have 5 men in formation to the Priesthood for our Archdiocese. However, it costs £30,000 a year to sponsor each seminarian.
