Corpus Christi

Each year, around this time in June, the Church invites us to pause and take stock, not of ourselves, but of the gift that makes us who we are. The Solemnity of Corpus Christi follows a remarkable succession of feasts: Ascension, Pentecost, Trinity Sunday. It is as though the Church is unfolding, one by one, the great realities of our faith; Christ exalted, the Spirit poured out, the inner life of God revealed, and then, suddenly, we are brought here: to the altar, to the Host, to the chalice. To Christ made present, given, and received.

Corpus Christi literally, the Body of Christ, was instituted for the whole Church in 1264 by Pope Urban IV, prompted by the Eucharistic devotion of a Belgian nun, Saint Juliana of Liège. Unlike Holy Thursday, where the Eucharist is remembered in the shadow of the Passion, this feast allows us to contemplate the Sacrament in its own right: the source and summit of Christian life, as the Second Vatican Council would later affirm.

From the fourteenth century onwards, Corpus Christi was marked by Eucharistic processions through towns and villages. Streets were swept, homes were decorated, flowers were laid in reverence, and bells rang out, not as spectacle, but as public witness. In Christ's Body, carried through the world, the Church saw itself: a people gathered and sent, a sacrament of unity. The Church in some parts continues to uphold these traditions with solemn devotion, while in others, it is the quiet adoration before the tabernacle that bears the same testimony of faith.

Though public customs have changed, the Church's teaching has not. What we receive is not a symbol or a memory. It is Christ Himself, whole and entire. In every Mass, the mystery of the Last Supper is renewed: "*This is my Body... This is my Blood.*" It is a declaration, not a metaphor.

But this is not only about what we receive. It is also about what we become. Saint Augustine, preaching to new communicants, said, "*Be what you see; receive what you are.*" We are the Body of Christ. The Eucharist does not end at the dismissal. It begins again in the world, in homes, in conversations, in acts of charity wherever the members of that Body live what they have received. In every sense, it is the Church's most radical calling and most enduring treasure.

Father's Day oversight

I am aware that Father's Day passed last Sunday without being acknowledged in some of our liturgical celebrations. This was a genuine oversight amidst the many other events taking place in the parish. However, this in no way reflects how deeply we value the fathers in our community. To all fathers, grandfathers, godfathers, and those who have been father-figures to others: thank you for all that you do - so often quietly, generously, and without seeking notice. We are truly grateful for your presence in our lives and in the life of the parish. A warm and heartfelt belated Happy Father's Day.
