Reflection

Christians continue their journey through the Easter season by celebrating the joy of Christ's resurrection from the dead. However, not all of us can switch to joy easily, especially when we are carrying the burdens of loss, of terminal illness, and of unwelcomed change. Mary Magdalene did not go to the tomb expecting to witness the miracle of the resurrection. She went there to face her deep sorrow and to perform the Jewish burial traditions. Her life was painfully altered by the death of Jesus. Only the Gospel of John reports Mary Magdalene's trauma and grief, Jesus' compassionate response, and his post-resurrection promise of eternal life.

Can we linger long enough at the empty tomb to let Christ's love shine through the pain and heaviness of our own hearts? God welcomes our grief, fears, confusions, and pain. During times of sorrow and in our darkest moments, like Mary we can fail to recognize Christ's presence standing with us. We cling to our losses and all that has been taken away from us. Moving forward is a struggle. Grief does not signal a lack of faith or trust in God. Christians grieve the loss, the separation, the dreams of relationships cut short; they do this with hope. For death is not the end but the transformation - the empty tomb remains but now as a sign of hope. We will remember both our losses and the palpable grief even as we hold on to the profound joy. Both can coexist.
