<u>Lent: What do you hope God's grace may do for you this Lent?</u>

In Lent, we should above all seek the grace of conversion – that is, of turning to Christ: praying that, in whatever particular ways each will mark this season, our devotions and penances will open our hearts anew to the love of Jesus Christ and to his call. The traditional ways for celebrating Lent are Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving; they can help us focus on our threefold relationships – with God, with ourselves, and with others.

Maundy Thursday Mass, 8pm

Feet are washed during the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper as another reminder to be like Jesus. No task, no service, no gesture is beneath those who bear the name Christian. Those who have been chosen from amongst the people of God are led by the ministers to seats prepared in a suitable place. Then the Priest goes to each one, and, with the help of the ministers, pours water over each one's feet and then dries them. We need 8 volunteers. A sign-up sheet is available in the Narthex. Just one foot required from each volunteer.
