Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Of special significance is the attached letter about the Synod which was reviewed at last week's mass. As an overview, the Synod is a world-wide journey initiated by Pope Francis to invite parishes to rediscover together - laity, clergy, and religious - what it means to be a servant-Church and what the Holy Spirit might be saying to the Church at this time. In the next step of this Synodal Process, each local parish is asked to host a meeting, or series of meetings, where conversations about the Church's mission in the life of the parish and the diocese can be prayerfully examined; and where the will of the Lord can be discerned, as we seek to grow in faith and number.

### Go Green This Halloween

Halloween is just around the corner. All those tricks and treats can add up to a lot of waste for the landfill. Up to 2,000 tonnes of plastic waste is estimated to be generated from Halloween costumes here in the UK alone. There are lots of ideas to help you have a Green Halloween.

- 1. Make your own Halloween costume or adapt one you already have. An old sheet can make a convincing ghost. Use old clothes as basics you can add cardboard and other accessories.
- 2. Buy locally grown pumpkins. You can even pick your own on some farms. You can also use the inside to make pumpkin soup or pie and roast the seeds.
- 3. Trick-or-Treat Bags. Use (and decorate) household items to collect sweets. A bucket, a tote bag or even an old pillowcase can be decorated inexpensively at home and reused year after year.
- 4. Think about your Halloween decorations. You can upcycle and paint cardboard for wall decorations and cut out cats, bats spiders and ghosts. Use netting from bags of oranges and leaves and branches from your garden. Reuse your decorations from last year.
- 5. Treats. Buy locally produced foods, sweets and treats. Look for goodies with minimal packaging and/or those made packaged in recycled materials.

## **Synod Introduction**

In last week's Pastoral letter the Archbishop explained that 'The Synod is an opportunity for everyone baptised into Christ to consider what it means to be a missionary disciple'. We believe this is also a wonderful opportunity for us to meet together, pray together and talk together about how we, as a Parish community, can grow together in communion, best participate in the life of the Church and so become more effective missionary disciples in the world.

## How the process works

You are invited to attend one hour-long, small group meeting to be held in the Presbytery. The meetings will begin with prayer and will then offer an opportunity for each participant to spend five minutes responding to the questions the Synod has asked us to consider. We will then reflect and close in prayer.

The meetings will be facilitated by the Parish Delegates, Mark Bithrey and Joan Henshaw. There will be note takers at each meeting – your responses will be recorded anonymously! – so that we can feedback your responses to the Diocese as part of the worldwide consultation leading towards the Synod of Bishops in Rome in 2023.

## **Preparation**

In order for participants to make the best use of their time we will ask that you spend some time in preparation reflecting on the six questions that will be sent to you and preparing your responses (you can answer all six questions or simply those you feel are most relevant to you).
