Reflection

Sometimes without even noticing it we can get locked-up into our own dayto-day world, our particular situation, and forget that we are part of a much bigger world. Today's Gospel about the glorious Transfiguration of Jesus on Mount Tabor reminds us of this, opens our eyes to it.

The three apostles with Jesus - Peter, James and John, see Jesus Transfigured in front of them 'his face shining, his clothes glorious, white as light'. Imagine their shock. And they hear a voice from out of a cloud saying 'This is my Beloved Son. Listen to him.'

These words are meant as much today for us as they were for the Apostles. If we open our hearts and minds to them they will be for us life-changing, life-giving. We may never experience anything as powerful as the Transfiguration, but every day God does break into our world in seemingly small ways. Every time we experience a moment of peace, of joy, of forgiveness, of reconciliation - God is there with us. Every time we reach out to help another person, or someone shows care or concern for us, these are moments when God is reaching out for us.
