Reflection

In our politicized and polarized world, disagreement quickly becomes vicious. Even if we don't attack others ourselves, around every corner on social media and news outlet, we are assaulted by meanness. The claim to truth rarely comes with kindness. It is not enough to disagree without being disagreeable, although that's a start.

Early in his papacy, Pope Francis wrote that truth is not something abstract, isolated, or detached from human relationship. It is not something to hold over another. 'Truth is a relationship,' he argued. It comes to us 'always and only as a way and a life. Did not Jesus himself say: 'I am the way, the truth, and the life'?' Indeed, the pope concluded, truth and love are one. How can we ever come into the truth without one another? It is easy, to borrow a phrase, to love the one you're with. It is easy to cheer along with your team, to rally with your party, to read posts by friends who share your views. It is easy to count Peter among the Twelve. It is much more difficult to welcome in Judas. It is a lot harder to love your enemy. If we think the decision to include Judas was dumb, if we write off those on the other side as irredeemable, then we are missing something - "Kindness and truth shall meet." Perhaps we can take a small step toward that wonderful vision by striving always to speak and to listen in love.
