Reflection

Laetare Sunday, the fourth Sunday of Lent, offers a moment of rest in the wilderness. It's very name *Laetare*, meaning "rejoice" signals a turning point. The violet softens to rose. The shadows give way to light. It is not Easter yet, but joy is already approaching. The Church invites her children to lift their eyes from the dust and see the mercy drawing near.

In the Gospel, Christ tells of a son who turned his back on his home and lost everything. He prepared words of repentance but never finished them. The father had already seen him from afar. He ran. He embraced. He forgave. Not because the son had earned it, but because he had come

home. This is not a story about Every Catholic is invalid failure. It is a story about love that indeed, called, to receive this waits and runs to meet us.

This is also Mothering Sunday, and many will rightly honour the women who bore them, fed them, and carried them in their hearts. This draws our attention to the Church herself, who is mother in the truest sense. She feeds her children, forms them, shelters them, and calls them back when they have wandered. Nowhere is this more beautifully seen than in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Here, the Church gathers her wounded and speaks words no human being can speak alone: "I absolve you."

Every Catholic is invited, indeed, called, to receive this sacrament at least once before Easter celebrations; not out of duty alone, but from a longing to be whole. It is not about recounting guilt but receiving grace. To confess is not to be diminished. It is to be made whole.

Whatever Lent has been for you - disciplined or distracted - it is not too late. The Father waits. The Church welcomes. God does not grow weary of us. He runs to meet us. All we must do is turn.
