Reflection

In July 2024, Pope Francis released a compelling letter titled *On the Role of Literature in Formation*, directed not only at priests and seminarians but also at the broader Christian community. The Pope takes unexpected yet profound an approach in this document, focusing on the spiritual and intellectual significance of reading literature novels, poetry, and the written word more broadly - as an essential element of Christian formation.

While the faithful might be accustomed to papal communications that delve into doctrinal, ethical, or social issues, this letter addresses something more personal and universal: the formation of the individual through the transformative power of reading. address Originally conceived to priestly formation, the Pope's reflections quickly extend to all believers, emphasizing that literature

is not just a form of entertainment but a powerful tool for personal growth, spiritual reflection, and pastoral sensitivity.

Pope Francis stresses that literature provides unique access to human heart, making indispensable for those engaged in pastoral work. By entering into the worlds created by novels and poems, encounter human readers experiences joys, struggles, suffering, and hope - in ways that are intimate and expansive. Through this imaginative exercise, empathy, grow discernment, and interior richness, which are critical for engaging with others, understanding culture, and deepening one's faith.

The Pope also criticizes the marginalization of literature within many seminary programs, arguing neglecting literary impoverishes the intellectual and

spiritual life of future priests. Instead, he advocates for a renewed embrace literature within formation programs, encouraging Christians to view literature as a vital pathway to encountering the deeper truths of human existence and, ultimately, the divine.

By placing literature at the centre of personal and pastoral development, Pope Francis opens up new avenues for dialogue between faith and culture, urging believers to draw from the wealth of literary traditions in their own spiritual journeys.
