#### Reflection

The Church comes to life at reached Pentecost. What accomplished in the Paschal Mystery - His death, resurrection, and ascension - is not complete until the Holy Spirit is poured out. That moment, fifty days after Easter, marks not an end, but a beginning. The Jewish feast of Shavuot, once recalling the gift of the Law to Moses, is fulfilled and transformed. Now, the gift is not written on tablets of stone, but on hearts open to grace.

In the Acts of the Apostles, we are told that the apostles were gathered in one place. They were not strategising, nor planning. They were waiting - obedient to Christ's command. When the Spirit came, it was not in silence or subtlety, but with clarity and power: a sound like wind, tongues like fire, speech that

life at reached across nations and Christ languages. The early Fathers saw aschal this not as disorder, but as the true ection, order of grace. St Cyril of Jerusalem nplete said it plainly: "With one voice and d out. many tongues they proclaimed one after faith" (Catechetical Lectures, 17.6).

This miracle of speech was no display of ecstatic utterance. The apostles spoke, and people from every nation heard the Gospel in their own language. The confusion of Babel was healed. What had once divided now became the path of communion. The Spirit did not told that the apostles were nered in one place. They were strategising, nor planning. They

The third Person of the Trinity would share in it, then we must first is not a passive force or abstract receive the Spirit who makes it energy. The Holy Spirit is the divine agent of mission. As Pope Benedict XVI wrote, "It is only through the

Holy Spirit that the Church is kept young and vibrant" (Homily, Pentecost 2010). Without Him, there is no evangelisation, no conversion, no transformation.

That same Spirit is offered to each of us. Through Baptism and Confirmation, we are anointed with the fire of Pentecost. The seven gifts - wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord—are not ceremonial relics. They are the divine means by which the Church speaks, serves, and sanctifies.

Pentecost is not a memory we admire. It is the power we need. The mission of Christ continues. If we would share in it, then we must first receive the Spirit who makes it possible.
