Reflection

As the summer season draws to a close and we embark on a new school year, we warmly welcome everyone back to our parish community. We extend our prayers and well wishes for students, teachers, and families as they begin this new chapter.

September also marks the start of the Season of Creation, a time dedicated to reflecting on our role as stewards of the planet, a responsibility that is shared by all of humanity. Our Parish's Green Team, inspired by the teachings of Pope Francis, continues to champion initiatives that emphasize the Christian duty to care for creation.

In his encyclical *Laudato SI*, Pope Francis reminds us of the grave responsibility that rests upon us: "The Earth, our home, is beginning to look more and more

like an immense pile of filth" (Laudato Si', 21). He urges us to recognize that "each community can take from the bounty of the Earth whatever it needs for subsistence, but it also has the duty to protect the Earth and to ensure its fruitfulness for coming generations" (Laudato Si', 67).

The Pope's call for ecological conversion is clear: caring for the planet is not simply an environmental issue, but a profoundly moral and spiritual responsibility that touches the heart of our faith.

In his recent Apostolic Exhortation *Laudate Deum*, Pope Francis strengthens this message by emphasizing that the time to act is now: "We are no longer faced with climate change as a future

problem; it is happening here and now. We cannot afford to waste any more time" (Laudate Deum, 12).

As we journey through the Season of Creation, let us remember that our care for the Earth is intimately connected to our Christian duty to love and serve one another.

In the words of Pope Francis: "Living our vocation to be protectors of God's handiwork is essential to a life of virtue; it is not an optional or secondary aspect of our Christian experience" (Laudato Si', 217). By embracing this responsibility, we honour God's creation and safeguard it for future generations, ensuring that our actions reflect the love and care we are called to show towards both the Earth and our fellow human beings.

For the Cry of the Earth: "Let us pray that each of us hears with the heart the cry of the Earth and victims of natural disasters and climate change, personally committing to care for the world we inhabit."
