Many are still being denied the right to leave their ships for even a short break away from the relentless noise and pressure onboard. Many are reporting more stress and poorer mental health. Message from Archbishop Pierbattista Pizzaballa, The Latin Patriarch of Jerusalem:

"The attack by the Israeli army on the Palestinian city of Jenin represents an "unprecedented" aggression, with "barbaric acts" that also destroy sacred sites and take the lives of people who desire and deserve a dignified life. This is reiterated by the Latin Patriarchate of Jerusalem in a communiqué published on Tues 4 July on the Israeli "aggression," which it says has also hit the local church and ecclesial community. The statement concludes with an appeal for an immediate ceasefire and an end to "unjust crimes". (Agenzia Fides)
