Message of Pope Francis for Lent 2025

As is customary each year at the start of Lent, Pope Francis has addressed pastoral message to Catholics worldwide. This year's Lenten message, titled "Let us journey together in hope," aligns closely with the theme of the 2025 Jubilee Year: "Pilgrims of Hope." The Holy Father structures his reflection around interconnected dimensionsjourneying, journeying together, and journeying in hope—calling the faithful towards meaningful conversion, solidarity, and spiritual renewal.

The Pope Francis grounds his reflections in the biblical account of Exodus, highlighting how the Israelites' pilgrimage to the Promised Land mirrors our contemporary spiritual journey towards God. Central to this pilgrimage is the constant call to conversion. The Pope challenges us to move beyond fear and complacency, asking each person to examine whether they are genuinely progressing or stagnating spiritually.

He emphasises empathy with
