## Today we celebrate the anniversary of the Consecration of St Osmund's by Archbishop Cowderoy in 1958

64 years later we thank God for the vision of those who worked so hard to achieve the building of a new Church and Hall, back in the day. We have a legacy which we need to maintain to hand on to the next generation. We are pursuing quotations for major repairs to the Hall, bringing it up-to-date and making it more welcoming and serviceable. Thanks to the Finance Committee who are overseeing the project which includes redecorating the Church. Plans will be shared at an upcoming parish meeting.

After the 10.30 Mass today, we will plant a tree as a legacy for future generations and as a sign of how we grew and served the Lord in our time. The tree also commemorates Her Majesty's Platinum Jubilee. It is a Cherry Tree, they bloom in Spring, saying summer is coming. In Spring we celebrate the Resurrection saying new life and hope for all. Refreshments in the garden.

**Wednesday, 29 June is the Feast of St Peter and Paul, a day of obligation. Mass – 10.00am, 6.30pm**

On the feast of Saints Peter and Paul, the Church remembers how their deaths planted the Faith in Rome, "O Roma felix, quae duorum Principum es consecrata glorioso sanguine!" (O happy Rome, which was consecrated by the glorious blood of the two Princes!) - A hymn we sang after feast day meals in the Seminary. Sung perhaps with more gusto this year at the closing of Womersley Seminary. St. Peter urges us to "remember the words spoken in the past by the holy prophets, and the commandment of the Lord and Saviour spoken through your apostles" (2 Peter 3:2). St. Paul encouraged the Christians in unruly Corinth: "Now I commend you because you remember me in everything and maintain the traditions even as I delivered them to you" (1 Corinthians 11:2). Both of these men were very different, and did not enjoy compatible temperaments but they were bound by a holy memory that had changed their lives.

**Collection today for Peter's Pence**

What is Peter's Pence? Peter's Pence is the name for the financial help offered by the faithful to the Holy Father in support of his apostolic and charitable mission in favour of the universal Church and the entire world. Each donation is a sign of communion with the Pope. Helping the Holy Father in his mission, Peter's Pence helps the Holy Father exercise his universal mission in two ways:

- makes possible works of service throughout the universal Church, carried out by the Offices assisting the Pope in evangelization, the promotion of integral human development, education and communication.
- contributes to numerous charitable works directly assisting the most in need; people and families in distress, hit by natural disasters or war.

**Secondary school transfer 2023. A Message from the Archbishop**

The Bishops have reinstated the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days. Parents applying for a place at a Catholic school, under faith-based criteria will need to complete a Supplementary Information Form. Evidence of practice will be measured by frequency of attendance at Mass as validated by either a priest or minister, as was the case prior to 18th March 2020. These arrangements apply to the admissions round for 2023 and forwards.
