Reflection

Today is the First Sunday of Advent.

Pope Francis: "Advent invites us to a commitment to vigilance, looking beyond ourselves, expanding our mind and heart in order to open ourselves up to the needs of people, of brothers and sisters, and to the desire for a new world."

St Francis de Sales: John the Baptist had already spent time preaching His coming, His miracles, and His greatness to his disciples. Now he wanted them to see Him whom he had announced to them. Surely, to make God known should be the principle aim of all. We ought neither to seek nor obtain anything but this: that He may be known to everyone. Therefore our glorious saint, John the Baptist, after having long preached to his disciples the coming of our Lord, now sends them to Jesus not only that they may know Him, but still more that they make Him known to others.

St Theresa of Avila: "I want to keep Advent in my soul, that is, a continual longing and waiting for this great Mystery wherein You, O Word, become flesh to show me the abyss of Your redeeming, sanctifying, mercy sweetest Jesus, You come to me with Your infinite love and the abundance of Your grace; You desire to engulf my soul in torrents of mercy and charity in order to draw it to You. Come, O Lord, come! I, too, wish to run to You with love, but alas! my love is so limited, weak, and imperfect! Make it strong and generous; enable me to overcome myself, so that I can give myself entirely to You.

Advent wreaths are constructed of a circle of evergreen branches into which four candles are inserted, representing the four weeks of Advent. The evergreens: Laurel, a symbol of Christ's Kingship; Holly, a symbol of Christ's Passion; Ivy, a symbol of our clinging to Christ and finally in gratitude, Rosemary for remembrance less we forget the wonderful things God has done for us. Ideally, three candles are purple and one is rose. The purple candles symbolize the prayer, penance. preparatory sacrifices and good works undertaken at this time. The rose candle is lit on the third Sunday, Gaudete Sunday. The priest wears rose coloured vestments. Gaudete Sunday is the Sunday of rejoicing, because we have arrived at the midpoint of Advent.

Service of the Word is at 10am on Tuesday 29 Nov and Wednesday 30 Nov.

The Jesse Tree has arrived at St Osmund's to welcome the season of Advent

The Jesse Tree is an ancient Advent tradition. The symbols that the children will hang on it as we move through Advent remind us of the prophesy in the bible foretelling the Messiah - A saviour 'sprung from the root of the tree of Jesse', the father of King David. Each symbol represents a landmark in the history of salvation, Christ's 'Family Tree', ending with baby Jesus in the manger.

Trees are vital symbols in Judaism and Christianity, from the Tree of Knowledge and the Tree of Life in the Garden of Eden to the redeeming Tree of the Cross. In the ancient Jesse tree, we salute these miracles of creation - the oldest living things on earth. We also recognise the vital part trees increasingly play in enriching human life and preserving God's creation.
