Diary of events

Sunday 12 November 2017 – Remembrance Sunday

At the 10.30 am Mass we will hold a minute silence in common with the Nation and pray for those who gave their lives in war and in the defence of the Realm. We hold in prayer all those in the Armed Forces today and those in the Emergency Services who work tirelessly for others. We ask a lot of them. We remember doctors, nurses, psychiatrists and medical personnel who respond to the victims of terrorism in our time. During November the Book of remembrance is kept on the Altar and the names of loved ones are prayed for at every Mass. Last week more names were added of deceased parishioners and families. Pope Francis writes: "*Praying for the dead* is, first and foremost, a sign of appreciation for the witness they have left us and the good that they have done. It is giving thanks to the Lord for having given them to us and for their love and their friendship. The Church prays for the deceased in a particular way during Holy Mass. The priest states: "Be mindful, O Lord, of thy servants who are gone before us with the sign of faith, and rest in sleep of peace. To these, O Lord, and to all that sleep in Christ, grant we beseech thee a place of refreshment, light and peace". It is a simple, effective, meaningful remembrance, because it entrusts our loved ones to God's mercy. We pray with Christian hope that they may be with him in Paradise, as we wait to be together again in that mystery of love which we do not comprehend, but which we know to be true because it is a promise that Jesus made. We will all rise again and we will all be forever with Jesus, with Him". Mass envelopes are available in the Narthex for those who wish to have Mass celebrated for a deceased relative or friend during November.

An Update on the Eucharistic Congress in September 2018

The Bishops of England and Wales will hold a National Eucharistic Pilgrimage and Congress in Liverpool next year from 7 - 9 September 2018. Each parish has been assigned two places for two delegates.

Eucharistic Congresses are gatherings of clergy, religious and laity which promote an awareness of the central place of the Eucharist in the life and mission of the Church. The last International Eucharistic Congress in England was held in 1908 when permission for a public procession of the Blessed Sacrament was refused. On the first day of the Congress, there will be a Theological Symposium, with workshops. Participants will also engage in a series of sessions focusing on different dimensions of the Eucharist and the daily celebration and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.

Children's Liturgy Group
