Tuesday 4 May - Feast of the English and Welsh Martyrs

After the Reformation, a violent wave of anti-Catholic persecution began backed by legislation which lasted three centuries. It began with the executions of the monks of Charterhouse, then St. Thomas More and St. John Fisher. Hundreds of persons, priests, laymen and laywomen were killed between 1535 and 1680. The Church recognized the heroism of 40 martyrs from England and Wales in a canonization ceremony on October 25, 1970. Later, a separate feast day was created on 4th May each year to recognize the 284 canonized or beatified martyrs of the English Reformation. Let us pray on 4 May for the unity of the Church.

May is the month of Mary; Mary is Queen of the May

Prayer to Our Lady, to untie the knots in our lives:

Virgin Mary, Mother of fair love, Mother who never refuses to come to the aid of a child in need, Mother whose hands never cease to serve your beloved children because they are moved by the divine love and immense mercy that exists in your heart, cast your compassionate eyes upon me and see the snarl of knots that exist in my life. You know very well how desperate I am, my pain and how I am bound by these knots. Vacancy

A vacancy has arisen for a volunteer to serve on the Board of Directors for The Barnes Fund Trustee Ltd, the corporate trustee to the two linked charities, The Barnes Fund and the Walsingham Lodge Trust, as a nominee of CTiB for an initial term of four years. The Board of nine Directors, all residents of Barnes, sets the strategic direction for the charities, and is responsible for ensuring that all relevant legal, financial and regulatory obligations are met. The Board also decides on grants to voluntary organisations and to individuals, oversees the management of the sheltered accommodation, Walsingham Lodge, and takes responsibility for stewardship of the Fund's financial and property investments.

To complement the skills of the Directors already on the Board, applications are currently sought from those with:

- Adult Social Services background understanding of The Care Act 2014, Mental Capacity Act 2005 and relevant government guidance, as well as the role local authorities play in supporting vulnerable adults.
- Experience working in a safeguarding role, as the successful candidate will need to fulfil duties as Designated Safeguarding Lead on the Board.
- An appreciation of some of the challenges facing local residents and voluntary organisations in Barnes and the Richmond Borough.

Prior experience of the workings of a charity or other voluntary organisation and/or experience in social housing is desirable but not essential. Candidates should be familiar with information technology; be regular users of email; be available occasionally during the daytime; and have the time to commit to this busy, but rewarding, voluntary position. Approximate time requirement: About 4 hours per month for meetings, plus approximately 1 or 2 hours per week. The Board meetings typically take place in the early evenings, with some committee meetings occurring during the daytime subject to trustee availability.
